Dear members of St Luke's,

The Trustees have decided to suspend services in church for the foreseeable future but will continue to monitor the situation and will review this decision no later than 17th February.

This was not an easy decision to make but we felt that we have a responsibility to respond to the current spread of Covid 19 and to share in protecting public health. Many of our congregation, volunteers and leaders are among the most vulnerable groups. We in Lodge Moor have been lucky so far but the anticipated rapid spread of the new variant cannot be ignored. With vaccinations now taking place we have hope that meeting together for worship will not be too far off and we would not want to do anything to jeopardise that.

There will be an on-line service each Sunday, alternating between the Connect Service and the Google site service. Look out for the joint Church service on the fifth Sunday in January.

We hope we are reaching all of you with the notice sheet, website, Facebook, thought for the week, printed and telephone sermons and prayer. Do keep in touch with one another. Let us know if there is anything else we can do.
